Throughout her career Darlene Olivia McElroy has combined head and heart in her journey of creating evocative mixed-media paintings. Trained as a painter and illustrator, she has an obsession for materials, a passion for dreamlike imagery, and love of new technologies, which she uses to immerse herself in richly-textured surfaces, mixtures of old and new, and brilliant and subdued tones. And always, there is a face or symbol of humanity that serves as a guide into mysterious layers which challenge reason and draw upon emotions.

In addition to being an artist and educator, she has written five art technique books which are testaments to her inherent need to experiment with all types of media. Several of her books have been translated into in German, Chinese and Korean.

She works in a great-room-turned-studio with large windows that let in New Mexico's ubiquitous sunshine, while looking out to a rustic yard, complete with ponds, waterfalls, wisteria-covered arbors and a herd of dogs. Her "casa de chaos" overflows with furniture parts, antique frames, ephemera, and cabinets filled with what she identifies as "S.H.I.T. (second-hand interesting things) that goes into her art.

Technique: Stencil Tricks

Of course you can buy stencils at art or craft stores but it is so much fun making your own unique ones orfinding objects around the house to use as stencils. Use stencils as texture plates or cut your own with stencil film for your unique personal designs. Go crazy layering them, deconstructing them, giving them texture and just having fun.

Paint Skins

I wanted butterflies that had a roughly painted look. Using my palette knife, I applied the Titan Buff and teal acrylic paint haphazardly together onto my polypropylene surface. The paint was allowed to dry overnight then was removed from the surface. This allows me to separate the elements that were stenciled in order to place them individually. The beauty of this technique is that you can use either side of the skin in your art. Apply shapes to art surface with soft gel.

11 Peal the dried stencil off plastic.



Add paint colors but don't mix.



Glue down with soft gel.

Paint Skins with Light Molding Paste

Apply light molding paste through a stencil on to a silicone texture plate. Remove stencil, let dry thoroughly, then peel the individual pieces off. Use the reverse side of the skin with has the pattern. Glue down with soft gel. Note: If you are unsure of your casting surface, first spray PAM on it as a mold release.




Each rain storm has a different feel. Against a bright blue sky it lifts you up while against a grey veil it makes you feel cold even on a warm day.

Technique: Foil Fun

Holographic adhesive film by Grafix comes in a variety of colors with patterns in it. When you peel the backing paper off you have an adhesive film to apply to your art. You can hand cut designs or use it with die cut machines like the Silhouette Cameo, Cricut or a Sizzix. After you have your design cut, peel off the backing and apply to your art with the adhesive side down. Either leave as is or paint over it leaving just a little of the sparkle to shine through.



Deconstruct, Reactivate, Bling It

Deconstructed stencils created with acrylic paint can be reactivated with alcohol. Stencils a paint and gel mixture on to a a sheet of polypropylene plastic. When the paint is thoroughly dry, spray the stenciled area with rubbing alcohol. This will reactivate the acrylic paint and make it tacky. While tacky, apply the holographic folio to the stenciled shapes. Remove the shapes from the plastic and glue down with soft gel.




Stenciled paint on a polypropylene sheet.
